






Cabinet approves MoU between the Department of Science and Technology, India and Ministry of Trade and Industry, Singapore

The Union Cabinet, chaired by the Prime Minister was apprised of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between the Department of Science and Technology of the Republic of India and the Ministry of Trade and Industry of the Government of the Republic of Singapore on Cooperation in the fields of Science, Technology and Innovation. The MoU was signed in February 2022.

The MoU will help in creating an ecosystem that will promote innovation and entrepreneurship in both countries leading to new technology creation, manpower training, and IP generation through collaboration.

The new knowledge and technology development through activities implemented under this cooperation will provide impetus to Atmanirbhar Bharat. The activities envisaged in the MoU will involve product development



and technology exchange which may lead to generation of new enterprises and employment.

Priority will be given to collaboration within any area of mutual interest that can advance progress in research, innovation and technological development including:

- Agriculture and food science and (1) technology
 - (2) Advanced manufacturing and

engineering

- (3)Green economy, energy, water, climate and natural resources
- Data science, Emerging **Technologies**
 - (5)Advanced Materials; and
 - Health and biotechnology.

Other areas of common interest will be included through mutual consent.

Cabinet approves Strategic Partnership Agreement between MNRE, India and the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA)

he Union Cabinet, chaired by the Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi was apprised of a Strategic Partnership Agreement signed between the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE), Government of India and the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA). The Agreement was signed in January 2022.

The aim of the Agreement is to drive ambition, leadership and knowledge on green energy transitions based on renewable energy in India. The Agreement will help India's energy transition efforts and will also help the world in combating climate change.

The areas of cooperation as envisaged in the Strategic Partnership Agreement will support India in achieving its ambitious target of 500 GW of installed non-fossil fuel electricity capacity by 2030. This inturn will promote Atmanirbhar Bharat.

The salient features of the Agreement include enhanced cooperation in the following areas:

- Facilitating knowledge sharing from India on scaling-up renewable energy and clean energy technologies
- Supporting India's efforts on (2) long term energy planning
- Collaborating to strengthen the innovation climate in India
- Moving towards costeffective decarbonisation through catalysing development and deployment of green hydrogen.

CCI approves proposed combination involving Google International LLC and Bharti Airtel Limited

oogle International LLC (Acquirer) is a wholly owned subsidiary of Google LLC, (collectively with all Google LLC subsidiaries, known as "Google"). Google LLC is a Delaware limited liability company and wholly owned subsidiary of Alphabet Inc. The Acquirer is a holding company and does not own / operate any of Google's products/ services. Google, however, offers various products and services, including its flagship search service, its Android operating system, and its Play app store.

Bharti Airtel Limited (BAL/ Target), headquartered in India, is an international communications solutions provider with over 480 million customers in 17 countries across South Asia and Africa, BAL's retail portfolio includes, amongst others, high speed mobile broadband, Airtel Xstream Fiber, streaming services (music and video), digital payments and financial services. For enterprise customers, BAL offers solutions including secure connectivity, cloud and data centre services, cyber security, IoT, advertising services, and cloud-based communication.

The Acquirer and Target have executed an Investment Agreement (IA) as per which the Acquirer proposes to acquire a minority and non-controlling stake of 1.28% of equity share capital in the Target. Along with the IA, the Parties have also entered into certain commercial deals through their affiliates. The Parties also intend to enter into other commercial arrangements in future. The CCI approved the proposed combination on the basis of information offered by the Acquirer.

Gazette Notification VICE – PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION, 2022

y a Notification published in the Gazette of India Extraordinary today (the 5th July, 2022), the Election Commission has appointed the following dates for the Vice-Presidential Election:-

- the 19th July, 2022 (Tuesday), as the last date for making nominations;
- the 20th July, 2022, (Wednesday), as the date for scrutiny of nominations:
- the 22nd July, 2022, (Friday), as the last date for the withdrawal of candidatures; and
- the 6th August, 2022, (Saturday), as the date on which a poll shall, if necessary, by taken.

the Commission vide separate Notifications issued on the 1st July, 2022, has appointed Shri Utpal Kumar Singh, Secretary-General, Lok Sabha as the Returning Officer for the Vice Presidential Election and Shri P.C. Tripathy, Joint Secretary and Shri Raju Srivastava, Director, Lok Sabha Secretariat, as the Assistant Returning Officers. As required under rule 3 of the Presidential and Vice Presidential Elections Rules, 1974, the Returning Officer by a Public Notes has notified today, the 5th July, 2022, that-

- nomination papers may be delivered by a candidate or any one of his proposers or seconders to the Returning Officer at his office in Room No. 18, Ground Floor, Parliament House, New Delhi, or if he is unavoidably absent, to the Assistant Returning Officer Shri P.C. Tripathy, Joint Secretary or Shri Raju Srivastava, Director, Lok Sabha Secretariat at the said office between 11 A.M. and 3 P.M. on any day (other than a public holiday) not later than the 19th July, 2022;
- each nomination paper shall be accompanied by a certified copy of the entry relating to the candidate

in the electoral roll for the Parliament constituency in which the candidate is registered as an elector;

- every candidate shall deposit or cause to be deposited a sum of rupees fifteen thousand only. This amount may be deposited in cash with the Returning Officer at the time of presentation of the nomination paper or deposited earlier in the Reserve Bank of India or in a Government Treasury and in the latter case a receipt showing that the said deposit of the sum has been so made is required to be enclosed with the nomination paper;
- forms of nomination papers may be obtained from the above said office at the time aforesaid;
- V. the nomination papers, other than those rejected under sub-section (4) of section 5B of the Act, will be taken up for scrutiny in Room No 62, First Floor, Parliament House, New Delhi on Wednesday, the 20th July, 2022 at 11 A.M.;
- the notice of withdrawal of VI. candidatures may be delivered by a candidate, or any one of his proposers or seconders who has been authorized on his behalf in writing by the candidate, to the Returning Officer at the place specified in paragraph (I) above before three o' clock in the afternoon of 22nd July, 2022;

VII. in the event of the election being contested, the poll will be taken on Saturday, the 6th August, 2022 between the hours of 10 A.M. and 5 P.M. at the place of polling fixed under the rules.

Arrangements have also been made for simultaneous republication of these Notifications and the Public Notice issued by the Returning Officer in Official Gazettes of all States/Union Territories.

After a 9-year lull, India and EU re-launch negotiations for India-EU Free Trade Agreement

n a joint event held at the Headquarters of the European Union (EU) at Brussels, Union Minister for Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs and Food & Public Distribution and Textiles, Shri Piyush Goyal, and Mr. Valdis Dombrovskis, Executive Vice-President of European Commission formally re-launched the India-EU Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations. Besides, negotiations were also launched for a stand-alone Investment Protection Agreement (IPA) and a Geographical Indicators (GIs) Agreement.

Last year, in the India and EU Leaders' Meeting, an agreement was reached for resuming negotiations for a balanced, ambitious, comprehensive and mutually beneficial FTA and starting fresh negotiations on the IPA and a separate agreement on GIs.

The FTA talks resumed after a gap of about nine years since the earlier

negotiations were left off due to difference in the scope and expectations from the deal. This would be one of the most significant FTAs for India as EU is its second largest trading partner after the US. The India-EU merchandise trade has registered an all-time high value of USD 116.36 billion in 2021-22 with a year-on- year growth of 43.5%. India's export to the EU jumped 57% in FY 2021-22 to \$65 billion. India has a surplus trade with EU.

Considering that both partners have similar fundamental values and common interests and are two of the largest open market economies, the trade deal will help to diversify and secure the supply chains, boost economic opportunities for our businesses, and bring significant benefits to the people. Both sides are aiming for the trade negotiations to be broad-based, balanced and comprehensive, based on the principles

of fairness and reciprocity. There will also be discussions on resolving the Market Access Issues which are impeding the bilateral trade. The proposed IPA would provide a legal framework for cross-border investments to enhance the confidence of investors. The GI pact is expected to establish a transparent and predictable regulatory environment, to facilitate trade of GI products including handicrafts and agricultural commodities. Both parties are aiming to negotiate all the three agreements in parallel and conclude them simultaneously.

India earlier this year has concluded FTAs with Australia and the UAE in a record time. The FTA talks with Canada and the UK are also underway. The FTA negotiations are part of India's broader strategy to forge balanced trade agreements with key economies and revamp existing trade pacts to improve trade and investment.

Assam, Chhattisgarh, Goa, Jharkhand, Kerala, Rajasthan and West Bengal have been placed in the Aspirers category.

Andaman & Nicobar, Bihar, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Puducherry and Tripura have been clubbed under the Emerging Business Ecosystems category.

Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman, Hon'ble Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs, announced the assessment of States/UTs under Business Reforms Action Plan (BRAP) 2020, the 5th edition of the BRAP exercise. The announcements were made in the presence of Shri Piyush Goyal, Hon'ble Minister of Commerce & Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution and Textiles, Shri Anurag Jain, Secretary, DPIIT and Senior Government officials of State and UT administration.

Speaking after release of assessment report, Smt. Sitharaman said that the nature of reforms had undergone change since 1991. "The reforms now taking place are responsive reforms. Unlike the reforms of 1991, which were given to us for implementation, there is no compulsion now. The objective is to see what will bring out improvement in systems and ensure better lives for us.



An element of nudge has been brought into every layer of the government. Nudging cannot be by the government only and the industry has a big role to play there.' the Finance Minister said. The Finance Minister appreciated the changes brought in the assessment framework of implementation under the Business Reforms Action Plan over years.

Speaking at the event, Shri Piyush Goyal, Hon'ble Minister for Commerce & Industry said that the assessment has evolved from evidence-based to 100% feedback in multilingual format. He said that the purpose of this BRAP exercise is to infuse a culture of learning from each other's best practices and improve upon the business climate in each State/ UT with a unified objective for India to emerge as a most favoured Investment Destination across the globe.

"When Hon'ble Prime Minister gave the thrust in 2014 to improving the ease of doing business, one of his major thrust areas was that while we are working at the international level for improving our ranking, we must involve all the stakeholders including the States and UTs in our effort to get them on board so that people really feel the difference and change in their

ecosystem, which will lead to ease of living," Shri Goyal said.

"The process started in 2014 has started bearing fruit as we go along. Rather than ease of doing business being limited to a few areas, few cities and few businesses, we are seeing it being reflected across the country through the spirit of competitive federalism and also of collaboration", the Commerce & Industry minister added.

Secretary, DPIIT Shri Anurag Jain said that the difference between various states/UTs was so small that it did not make sense to rank them but rather put them in various categories.

The BRAP 2020 includes 301 reform points covering 15 business regulatory areas such as Access to Information, Single Window System, Labour, Environment, Land Administration & Transfer of Land and Property, Utility Permits and others. 118 new reforms were included to further augment the reform process. Sectoral reforms with 72 action points spread across 9 sectors namely Trade License, Healthcare, Legal Metrology, Cinema Halls, Hospitality, Fire NOC, Telecom, Movie Shooting and Tourism were introduced for the first time to expand the scope of reform agenda.

Design led manufacturing under Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for Promoting Telecom and Networking Products Manufacturing in India



epartment of Telecommunications (DoT) had notified the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme on 24th February 2021, with a financial outlay of ₹ 12,195 Crores. A total of 31 companies, comprising of 16 MSMEs and 15 Non-MSMEs including 8 Domestic and 7 Global companies were given approval on 14th October, 2021.

With the objective to build a strong ecosystem for 5G, the Union Budget 2022-23 had proposed to launch a Scheme for design-led manufacturing as part of the existing PLI Scheme. After consultations with stakeholders, the Guidelines for the PLI Scheme for Telecom & Networking Products have been amended to introduce the Designled Manufacturing with additional incentive rates. Further, DoT based on feedback from stakeholders including the selected PLI Applicants, has decided to extend the existing PLI Scheme by one year. The existing PLI beneficiaries will

be given an option to choose financial year 2021-22 or financial year 2022-23 as the first year of incentive. DoT has also approved the addition of 11 new telecom and networking products to the existing list, based on suggestions from the stakeholders.

For promoting design-led manufacturing, Department of Telecommunications (DoT) is inviting applications from Designled manufacturers as well as others, for availing incentive under the PLI Scheme for five years commencing from 1st April 2022. Investment made by successful applicants in India from 1st April 2022 onwards and till Financial Year (FY) 2025-2026 will be eligible, subject to qualifying incremental annual thresholds. The Scheme is open to both MSME and Non-MSME Companies including Domestic and Global Companies. The applications from Design-led manufacturers shall be prioritized over other manufacturers

while shortlisting. The Design Led Manufacturing is primarily aimed to support efforts for designing telecom products in India. It will recognize and encourage R&D-driven manufacturing in the country to enhance its contribution to global value chain as envisaged in the National Digital Communication Policy, 2018.

Applicants will have to satisfy the minimum Global Revenue criteria to be eligible under the Scheme. The Company may decide to invest for single or multiple eligible products. The Scheme stipulates a minimum investment threshold of ₹10 Crores for MSME and ₹100 Crores for non MSME applicants. Land and building cost will not be counted as investment. Eligibility shall be further subject to Incremental Sales of Manufactured Goods (covered under Scheme Target Segments) over the base year (FY2019-20). The allocation for MSME has been enhanced from ₹1000 Crores to ₹2500 Crores.

Digital India Week flagged off with Digital Mela and a Bouquet of launches

elebrations of Digital India Week were inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in the presence of Chief Minister of Gujarat Shri Bhupendra Patel, Hon'ble Minister of Electronics & IT, Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw, Hon'ble Minister of State for Electronics & IT, Shri Rajeev Chandrasekhar, and several other dignitaries.



Some of the beneficiaries got the opportunity to interact and share their experiences with the Prime Minister. Shri Rajeev Chandrasekhar, MoS, Electronics & IT, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship talked about the growth of Digital India since its inception and shared how Digital India enabled Bharat to shift from a 'Tech consumer to a Tech producer'. Addressing the gathering, the Chief Minister of Gujarat remarked that by generating an automated cycle of planning, implementation, and feedback, Digital India has given a direction to the government with changing times. ONGC Videsh announces new discovery in Colombia

NGC Videsh Limited (OVL), the wholly owned subsidiary and overseas arm of Oil and Natural Gas Corporation Ltd. (ONGC), has made an oil discovery in the recently drilled well, Oil discovery in the Lower Mirador play in this well opens up new areas for further exploration in the northern part of the block. OVL had earlier discovered commercial oil in the Lower Sand



pay in Mariposa and Indico fields in the block in 2017 and 2018 respectively, The fields are currently commercially producing @ 20,000 bbl oil per day.

Block CPO-5 was awarded to OVL in the 2008 bid round of Colombia. OVL holds 70% participating interest (PI) in the block along with operatorship, and remaining 30% is held by partner Geopark.

OVL has a significant presence in the oil & gas sector in Colombia, with three other exploratory blocks in the country and joint ownership of the oil producing company Mansarovar Energy Colombia Ltd (MECL)

Significant decisions to augment medical care and service delivery mechanism taken at the 188th meeting of ESIC

■ SI Corporation under the **◄** Chairmanship of Shri Bhupender ✓ Yadav, Minister of Labour & Employment, Environment, Forest & Climate Change, in its 188th meeting has taken significant decisions to augment the medical care and service delivery mechanism across the country.

It has been decided that ESI Scheme will be implemented in the entire country by the end of year 2022. Presently, ESI Scheme is fully implemented in 443 districts and partially implemented in 153 districts, whereas 148 districts are not covered under ESI Scheme. By the end of year 2022, all districts across the country will be fully covered.

Medical care services will be provided by empanelling Hospitals of Ayushman Bharat PMJAY. ESI Corporation has decided to set up 23 new 100 bedded hospitals across the country. Six hospitals in Maharashtra at Palghar, Satara, Pen, Jalgaon, Chakan and Panvel; four hospitals in Haryana at Hisaar, Sonepat, Ambala and Rohatak; two hospitals each in the state of Tamil Nadu (at Chengalpattu and Erode), Uttar Pradesh (Moradabad and Gorakhpur) and Karnataka (Tumkurand Udupi), one ESI hospital each in the state of Andhra Pradesh (Nellore), Chhatisgarh (Bilaspur), Goa (Mulgaon Goa), Gujarat (Sanad), Madhya Pradesh (Jabalpur), Odisha (Jharsuguda) and West Bengal (Kharagpur) will be set-up by ESIC. Besides these Hospitals, 5 doctors' dispensaries at 62 places will also be opened. 48 dispensaries in Maharashtra, 12 dispensaries in Delhi and 2 dispensaries in Haryana will be opened. These hospitals and dispensaries will ensure the delivery of quality medical care service to the insured workers and their dependents in the close vicinity of their residence and will also enhance

clientele satisfaction.

To fulfil the growing need for skilled manpower in Health Care sectors and narrow the existing gap between the demand and supply of skilled manpower, ESIC is going to start Certificate Courses in 10 disciplines in three of its Medical Colleges at Faridabad, Sanathnagar (Hyderabad) and K.K.Nagar (Chennai) for Health Care Link Workers, as a pilot project. To provide quality medical care, ESIC is augmenting its infrastructure by settingup new hospitals and upgrading the existing ones. As setting up new hospitals takes time, ESIC in its meeting decided to allow insured workers and their family members to avail cashless medical care services through Ayushman Bharat PMJAY empanelled hospitals in all the areas where ESI Scheme is partially implemented or to be implemented or where ESIC existing health care facilities are limited. Beneficiaries of ESI Scheme in 157 districts are already availing cashless medical care through this tie-up arrangement. This decision will immensely help beneficiaries to avail cashless medical services in the remaining districts. Union Labour Minister, Shri Bhupendra Yadav informed that 6400 vacancies for different posts have been advertised by ESIC in last eight months which includes more than 2000 Doctors/Teaching faculty. It was decided that Radiation Oncology and Nuclear Medicine Departments at three ESIC Medical College & Hospitals at Sanathnagar, Faridabad and Chennai will be established. It will be the for the first time that such services will be made available at ESIC owned facility. Two Cath Labs at ESIC Medical College & Hospital at Sanathnagar, Telangana and Alwar, Rajasthan will be established. Recently, one Cath Lab was made



functional at ESIC Medical College & Hospital at Faridabad, Haryana. Decision was also taken to upgrade the existing 200 bedded ESIC Hospital, Pune to 500 bedded Hospital. The upgradation of this Hospital will benefit 7 Lakh Workers and their family members in Pune. ESIC in the meeting also decided to set-up a new 100 bedded ESI Hospital at Ernakulam, Kerala. This Hospital will be equipped with all the modern health care facilities as per ESIC Norms. The multi-story Hospital will also house the Sub-Regional Office, Ernakulum.

Other Important Decisions taken in Meeting included improving the medical care services of Insured Workers and their family members, ESIC has decided to take over the State Govt. run ESIS Hospital, Sonagiri, Bhopal to directly run it under its administrative control and also bridging the gap of non-availability of Specialist/Super Specialists in State Govt. run ESIS Hospitals, ESIC will now engage required Specialist/Super Specialists for ESIS Hospitals. Over all expenditure against engaging these Specialist/Super Specialists will also be borne by ESIC. It will ensure availability of specialist/super specialist services in ESIS Hospitals.

In a deliberation on Swasthya se Samridhi in which the matters of providing social security to workers, bringing more workers under the ambit of ESI Scheme, service delivery augmentation, etc. were discussed.

Front Runners for President of India

India will have a new President by 21 July 2022

Asheesh Bhandari

he term of office of the current President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind, ends on 24th July, 2022. The Constitution of India (Article 62) requires that an election to fill the vacancy be completed before the term expires.

By law, the superintendence, direction, control, and conduct of election to the office of the President of India vests in the Election Commission of India. The election must be free and fair and the Commission must take all necessary steps for discharging its constitutional responsibility.

The Constitution of India (Article 54) provides that the President of India be elected by the members of an Electoral College made up of -

elected members of both Houses of Parliament, and

(II) elected members of the Legislative Assemblies of all States including National Capital Territory of Delhi and the Union Territory of Puducherry

The nominated members of either Rajya Sabha, Lok Sabha, Legislative Assemblies of the States, or the Legislative Councils are not entitled to participate in the election.

The election is held in accordance with the system of proportional representation by means of the single transferable vote and the voting at such election is by secret ballot. The total number of votes for MLAs for the 16th Presidential Election is 543,231. The total number of votes for MPs is 543,200. The total value of vote of all electors for the Presidential Election, 2022 is 1,086,431. This is broken down in a prescribed manner.

Droupadi Murmu, former Iharkhand Governor, was announced as the National Democratic Alliance's candidate for the presidential polls. She will face former Union Minister Yashwant Sinha, who was selected as the joint Opposition candidate in the upcoming election. Both candidates filed their nominations in the presence of their supporters. The last date for the filing of nominations for the presidential election was on June 29 and voting will take place on July 18. Counting of votes will take place on July

Here is some information about the contenders.

The Government's Candidate - Droupadi Murmu

roupadi Murmu was born in the Santhal community of Odisha's



Baidaposi village on June 20, 1958. She struggled with poverty in her childhood in one of the most remote and underdeveloped districts of the country. Droupadi Murmu graduated from Ramadevi Women's college, which is located in Odisha's Bhubaneswar, with a



bachelor's degree in Arts. Before joining politics, she taught children as a school teacher and worked as a junior assistant in the irrigation and power department for four years till 1983.

She began her political career after she became a councillor on a BJP ticket in the Rairangpur Nagar Panchayat in 1997. She then became the vice president of BJP's scheduled tribes morcha. Droupadi Murmu was elected twice as an MLA on a BJP ticket from the Rairangpur constituency in 2000 and 2004. In 2002, she was appointed as the Commerce and Transport Minister in the Naveen



Murmu also addressed the local media after the news of her candidature was announced and said, "I would like to thank the party for nominating me as the presidential candidate. I would request the support of all public representatives for my election." She added that her name was also doing the rounds in 2017 and she had asked Naveen Patnaik for his party's support. Odisha's ruling party Biju Janata Dal (BJD) however, supported NDA's candidate Ram Nath Kovind in the 2017 presidential elections.

Patnaik cabinet. In 2004, Droupadi Murmu was appointed as the Fisheries and Animal Development Minister in Naveen Patnaik's second term as chief minister. She was conferred the Nilkanth award in 2007 for best MLA by Odisha Legislative Assembly. In 2015, she was appointed the Governor of Jharkhand, becoming the first-ever tribal leader at the post which she held till 2021.

Droupadi Murmu is recognised as a strong tribal political leader. During her tenure as Governor of Jharkhand, she returned the bills introduced by the BJP to amend the Chhotanagpur Tenancy Act (CNT) and Santhal Pargana Tenancy Act (SPT). Tribals of Jharkhand vigorously opposed the erstwhile BJP

government's proposed amendments to the CNT & SPT Acts.

Droupadi Murmu was married to Shyam Charan Murmu and the couple had two sons and a daughter. However, tragedy struck and she lost her husband and both sons.

BJP chief J P Nadda announced Droupadi Murmu's name as the National Democratic Alliance's candidate for the presidential polls. Following the announcement, Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweeted, "Smt. Droupadi Murmu Ji has devoted her life to serving society and empowering the poor, downtrodden as well as the marginalised. She has rich administrative experience and had an

outstanding gubernatorial tenure. I am confident she will be a great President of our nation."

Murmu also addressed the local media after the news of her candidature was announced and said, "I would like to thank the party for nominating me as the presidential candidate. I would request the support of all public representatives for my election." She added that her name was also doing the rounds in 2017 and she had asked Naveen Patnaik for his party's support. Odisha's ruling party Biju Janata Dal (BJD) however, supported NDA's candidate Ram Nath Kovind in the 2017 presidential elections.

A senior BJD leader said that the party will now support Droupadi Murmu as the presidential candidate as she is a tribal woman and hails from Odisha. The leader added that if Murmu wins the election, she will be the first native from Odisha to hold the topmost constitutional post. She will also be India's first tribal President and India's second lady President.

As the NDA commands 48 per cent of the electoral vote, the chances of her winning the Presidential election are fairly good.

The Oppositions Candidate - Yashwant Sinha

ormer Union Minister Yashwant Sinha has been selected as the joint Opposition candidate for the upcoming presidential polls. Sinha filed his nomination papers on June 27, 2022.

The former TMC leader said that it was time to step aside from party politics and work for a larger national interest. The decision came soon after the TMC decided to propose his name



as the joint Opposition candidate for the top post.

"I am grateful to Mamataji for the honour and prestige she bestowed on me in the TMC. Now a time has come when for a larger national cause, I must step aside from the party to work for greater opposition unity. I am sure she approves of the step," Sinha tweeted.

On June 15, 2022 West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee had called a meeting of 17 Opposition parties to build consensus for a joint presidential candidate against the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA). Opposition leaders, who gathered at a Parliament annexe meeting convened by NCP chief Sharad Pawar, agreed on Sinha's name. The parties that attended the meeting include the Congress, NCP, TMC, CPI, CPI-M, Samajwadi Party, National Conference, AIMIM, RJD and AIUDF.

"I would like to congratulate Yashwant Sinha on becoming the consensus candidate, supported by all progressive opposition parties. A man of great honour and acumen, who would surely uphold the values that represent our great nation," Mamata

Baneriee tweeted after the selection.

Yashwant Sinha born 6 November 1937, is an Indian administrator and politician. He served as the Finance Minister from 1990 until 1991 under Prime Minister Chandra Shekhar and again from March 1998 to July 2002 under Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee. He served as the Minister of External Affairs from July 2002 until May 2004. He was a senior leader of the BJP before he left the party on 21 April 2018. In March 2021 he joined the All India Trinamool Congress and resigned on being elected the opposition's candidate for the Presidential Elections in July 2022.

Sinha was born in a Kayastha family in Patna, Bihar. He received his master's degree in Political Science in 1958 and taught the subject at the University of Patna till 1962.

Sinha was a part of the Indian Administrative Service for over 24 years holding important posts during his service tenure. From 1971 to 1973, he was First Secretary (Commercial) in the Indian Embassy in Germany. Subsequently, he worked as Consul

General of India in Frankfurt from 1973 to 1974. After working for over seven years in this field, he acquired experience in matters relating to foreign trade and India's relations with the European Economic Community.

Thereafter, he worked in the Department of Industrial Infrastructure, Government of Bihar State and in the Ministry of Industry, Government of India dealing with foreign industrial collaborations, technology imports, intellectual property rights, and industrial approvals.

He was the Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Surface Transport from 1980 to 1984, where his main responsibilities were road transport, ports, and shipping. He resigned from service in 1984 to join active politics as a member of the Janata Party.

Sinha was appointed All-India General secretary of the party in 1986 and was elected Member of the Rajya Sabha in 1988. When the Janata Dal was formed in 1989, he was appointed General Secretary of that party.

Yashwant Sinha became the National Spokesperson of the BJP in June 1996. He was elected to Lok Sabha as a BJP candidate from Hazaribagh in 1998, 1999, and 2009. He was appointed Finance Minister in March 1998 and as Minister for External Affairs on 1 July 2002. In the Lok Sabha elections of 2004, he was defeated in Hazaribagh Constituency by the able efforts of Prashant Sahay who later saved his life as well. He re-entered the Parliament in 2005. On 13 June, 2009, he resigned from the post of vice-president of BJP. In 2018, he quit the BJP citing the "party's condition" and that "democracy in India is in great danger".

On 13, March 2021 Yashwant Sinha joined the TMC to fight against BJP and on 15 March, 2021 he was appointed vice president of the party.

In 2015, he was awarded Officier de la Legion d'Honneur, the highest civilian distinction of France. It was bestowed upon him in recognition of his work as Union Minister of Finance, Minister of External Foreign Affairs and for his invaluable contribution to international issues.

Judging by the parties involved in the negotiations that led to his candidature, Sinha is likely to get the support of the entire Congressled United Progressive Alliance, the Trinamool Congress, Left Parties and other anti-BJP parties like the RJD, Samajwadi Party, Rashtriya Lok Dal, Janata Dal (Secular) etc.

What works in Sinha's favour is his seniority, having being finance minister and external affairs minister in the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government and finance minister in the Chandra Shekhar government.

The other potential **Opposition Candidates**

The NDA coalition considered over 20 candidates for the Presidential Elections. Before selecting Yashwant

degree from SMS Medical College in Jaipur and prior to joining politics, he practiced medicine in UK.

Abdullah was elected to the Lok Sabha unopposed in the 1980 General Election. He was a novice in the political arena of Jammu & Kashmir when he was appointed President of the National Conference in August 1981. His main qualification was that he was the son of Sheikh Abdullah. After his father's death in 1982, Farooq Abdullah became the Chief Minister of the state. In 1984, a faction of the National conference led by his brother-in-law broke away, leading to the collapse of his government and his dismissal.

In 1986, a new National Conference-Congress government was sworn in with Abdullah as the Chief Minister. after the Rajiv-Farooq accord. Farooq Abdullah resigned in 1987 in protest after the state was brought under Governor's rule. He then moved to UK.

After returning to India, and winning



Sinha as their candidate, the Opposition parties jointly considered others too, who turned down the offer. They were: arooq Abdullah is the President

of Jammu & Kashmir National Conference. He has served as the Chief Minister of Jammu & Kashmir on several occasions since 1982, and as the Union Minister for New and Renewable Energy between 2009 and 2014. He is the son of the 1st elected Chief Minister of Jammu & Kashmir, Sheikh Abdullah, and father of former Chief Minister of Jammu & Kashmir, Omar Abdullah.

Farooq Abdullah holds an MBBS

the Legislative Assembly Elections in 1996, Abdullah was once again sworn in as Chief Minister of the state. His government lasted a full six-year term. In 1999, the National Conference joined the National Democratic Alliance and his son Omar Abdullah was appointed a Union Minister of State.

In the 2002 elections, Omar Abdullah was chosen to lead the National Conference, while Farooq Abdullah intended to continue his political career at the Central level. Farooq Abdullah was elected to the Rajya Sabha in 2002 from Jammu &

Kashmir and re-elected in 2009. He resigned from the Rajya Sabha in May 2009 and won a seat in the Lok Sabha from Srinagar. Abdullah joined the UPA government as the Cabinet Minister of New and Renewable Energy.

On 16 September, 2019, Abdullah became the first mainstream politician to be detained under the Public Safety Act. Prior to this, Abdullah was under house arrest since the scrapping of Article 370 of the Constitution of India. He was released from house detention under the PSA after seven and a half months on 13 March, 2020.

In 2022, before the election of the President of India, Mamata Bannerjee along with several other opposition leaders had proposed Abdullah's name as the Opposition's candidate. But Abdullah declined the offer stating that he wanted to remain in active politics for more years and was concentrating

on the Kashmir Union Territory issue.

Charad Govindrao Pawar,

served as the Chief Minister of Maharashtra on three occasions. He has held the posts of Minister of Defence and Minister of Agriculture in the Government of India. He is President of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), which he founded in 1999, after separating from the Indian National Congress. Sharad Pawar is the Chairperson of Maha Vikas Agadhi.

Outside of politics, Pawar served as the Chairman of the BCCI from 2005 to 2008 and as the President of the ICC from 2010 to 2012. He was the president of the Mumbai Cricket Association for many years.

In 2017, the Indian government conferred upon him the Padma Vibhushan, the second-highest civilian honour of India.

Pawar's first political activity was when he was a schoolboy. He organized a protest march for Goan Independence in Pravaranagar in 1956. At college he was active in student politics. Pawar



preferred the Congress party and joined the Youth Congress in 1958. In 1964, he was one of the two secretaries of Maharashtra youth congress and in regular contact with influential leaders of the party.

From 1967 till 1999, Sharad Pawar served in the Congress Party and rose to be an important personality in National politics and more particularly in politics of the state of Maharashtra.

In 1999, after the 12th Lok Sabha was dissolved and elections to the 13th Lok Sabha were called, Pawar and some other leaders demanded that the Congress Party needed to propose someone native-born as the prime ministerial candidate and not the Italian-born Sonia Gandhi, who had entered party politics and replaced Kesri as Congress President. In response, the Congress Working Committee (CWC) expelled Pawar and others from the party for six years. In response the Nationalist Congress Party was formed in June 1999.

Despite the illustrious political career, Sharad Pawar is named in a number of scams and accused of numerous wrong-doings

Amid speculation that former Union Minister Sharad Pawar may be the opposition's consensus candidate in the election for President of India, his party (NCP) has said that Mr Pawar will take a decision "only if the opposition parties have the numbers for a victory".

Gopalkrishna Devdas Gandhi is a former diplomat who served as the 22nd Governor of West Bengal from 2004 to 2009. He is the grandson of Mahatma Gandhi. As a former IAS officer he served as Secretary to the President of India and as the High Commissioner to South Africa and Sri Lanka, among other administrative and diplomatic posts. He was the UPA nominee for Vice President in the 2017 elections but lost with 244 votes against 516 votes.

opalkrishna Devdas Gandhi was born on 22 April 1945 in Delhi, to Devdas and Lakshmi Gandhi. His father was a journalist. Gandhi graduated with a master's degree in English literature.

He joined the IAS as an Officer in 1968 and served in Tamil Nadu till 1985. Thereafter, he remained Secretary to Vice President of India (1985-1987), and Joint Secretary to President of India (1987-1992).

In 1992 he became Minister (Culture) in the High Commission of India in UK and the Director of The Nehru Centre in London. This was followed by various diplomatic and administrative positions for the rest of his career. He retired from the IAS in 2003.

On 14 December 2004, he was appointed Governor of West Bengal. After that, for a few months in 2006 he also took on additional duties as the

Governor of Bihar.

Gandhi now teaches at the Ashoka University, where he is a Professor of History and Politics.

Turning down his candidature for the President of India, Gandhi said he believes the Presidential candidate needs to generate national consensus and there will be other candidates who will be better suited for the top Constitutional position.

"Several esteemed leaders of the Opposition have done me the honour of thinking of me for the Opposition's candidature in the upcoming elections for the highest office of Rashtrapati. I am most grateful to them. But having considered the matter deeply I see that the Opposition's candidate should be one who will generate a national consensus and a national atmosphere beside Opposition unity. I feel there will be others who will do this far better than I. And so I have requested the leaders to give the opportunity to such a person. May India get a President worthy of the office presaged by Rajaji as the last Governor General and inaugurated by Dr Rajendra Prasad as our first President."


Completing a full term successfully!

The 14th President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind successfully completes his five year term on 25 July, 2022. Here is a brief of the President and his achievements.

Ram Nath Kovind was born on 1 October 1945, in Paraunkh village in the Kanpur Dehat district of Uttar Pradesh. He is the youngest of seven children of Maiku Lal and Kalawati. His father ran a shop and was also a farmer. His mother was a homemaker. Ram Nath Kovind was born in a mud hut, which caught fire and collapsed. He was only five when his mother died of burns when their thatched dwelling caught fire.

After his elementary school education, he would walk each day to Kanpur village, 8 km (5.0 mi) away, to attend junior school, as nobody in the

Ghatampur assembly constituency, but lost. In the 2007 elections he contested the Bhognipur assembly constituency but lost again.

In 1997, being from the Koli community, Kovind joined a protest against certain orders of the Central government that had adverse effects on the Schedule Cast and Schedule Tribe workers. Three amendments to the Constitution of India revoked these

In April 1994, Ram Nath Kovind was elected and became a Rajya Sabha Member of Parliament ('MP') from Uttar Pradesh. He served two consecutive terms till March 2006.

As a MP, he served on the following Parliamentary Committees:

- Welfare of Scheduled Castes/ Tribes,
 - Home Affairs
 - Petroleum and Natural Gas
 - Social Justice and

His career in Law

With a law degree in hand, Ram Nath Kovind left for Delhi to prepare for the civil services examination. He passed the exam on his third attempt with scores high enough to work in an allied service rather than in the prestigious IAS.

In 1971, Kovind enrolled as an advocate with the Bar Council of Delhi. He was a Central Government Advocate in the Delhi High Court from 1977 to 1979. Between 1977 and 1978, he also served as the personal assistant to the then Prime Minister of India, Morarji Desai. In 1978, he became an advocate-on-record of the Supreme Court of India and served as a standing counsel for the Central Government from 1980 to 1993. He practised in the Delhi High Court and Supreme Court until 1993. As a practising advocate, he provided pro-bono aid to weaker sections of society, women and the poor


His Career in Politics

Ram Nath Kovind joined the BJP in 1991. He was the president of the BJP Dalit Morcha between 1998 and 2002 and also the president of the All-India Koli Samaj. He also served as the national spokesperson of the party. Soon after joining the BJP, he contested the

He was also the chairman of the Rajya Sabha House Committee. As a parliamentarian, Ram Nath Kovind focused on education in rural areas by helping in the construction of school buildings in Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand under the Members of



Parliament Local Area Development Scheme. As a MP he visited various countries on study tours. And in October 2002, he visited the United Nations and addressed the UN General Assembly.

On 8 August 2015, the then President Pranab Mukherjee appointed Kovind as the 26th Governor of Bihar; a position he held till his nomination as a presidential candidate in 2017. The appointment was criticised by then Chief Minister of Bihar, Nitish Kumar as the appointment was made without consulting the state government.

However, as the Governor, Kovind was praised for constituting a judicial commission to investigate irregularities in promotion of undeserving teachers, mismanagement of funds and appointment of undeserving candidates in universities. In June 2017, when he was announced as a presidential candidate, Nitish Kumar backed the choice and praised Kovind as being unbiased and working closely with the state government during his

governorship.

Ram Nath Kovind became the President of India on 25 July 2017 having won the election with 65.5% of the votes. He became the second Dalit representative to become President after KR Narayanan, and the first BJP candidate with a RSS background to be elected to the highest Constitutional post.

His term as President of India As the President of India, Ram Nath Kovind received the following State Honours:

- 1. National Order of Madagascar - This is the highest civilian honour of Madagascar that may be bestowed upon foreign dignitaries. It falls in the category of Grand Cross 2nd Class. (14 March 2018)
- Order of Independence, Equatorial Guinea - Degree of Collar (8 April 2018)
- 3. Order of the Lion, Eswatini -The highest civilian honour of Eswatini (9 April 2018)

- Grand Order of King Tomislav, Croatia - The highest civilian honour of Croatia (26 March 2019)
- Order of the Condor of the Andes, Bolivia - Grand collar, the highest civilian honour in Bolivia (26 March 2019)
- 6. National Order of Merit, Guinea - Grand Cross, the highest civilian honour in Guinea (3 August 2019)

Domestically, President Kovind imposed President's Rule in three states during his term. Under Article 356 of the Constitution of India, if a state government cannot function according to Constitutional provisions, the Union government can take direct control of the state machinery by imposing the President's rule in the state..

President's rule was imposed in the former state of Jammu & Kashmir from June 19, 2018 to October 31, 2019, after the Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti resigned. It continued until October 31, 2019, when the state was split into two

Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir, and Ladakh. After the split, President's rule continued in the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir imposed under section 73 of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization Act.

President's rule was imposed in Maharashtra from November 12, 2019 to November 23, 2019, as no party could form a government after a fractured election outcome. It was lifted when Devendra Fadnavis was sworn in as chief minister.

In Puducherry, President's rule was imposed from February 25, 2021, upon the resignation of the chief minister when there was no alternate claimant to form the next government.

President Kovind appointed 4 Chief Justices of the Supreme Court of India and 26 of the 33 Justices of the same court.

During his term as President of India, he travelled to 28 different countries on State Visits. Notable among these State Visits were -

Djibouti and Ethiopia -October 3 to 6, 2017

This was the first visit in 45 years by an Indian President to Djibouti. An agreement to establish Foreign Office level consultations was signed between the two countries. The President also granted assistance of US\$ 600 million which included an India - Africa Development fund of US\$ 100 million and an India - Africa Health Fund of Us \$ 10 million.

In Ethiopia, the President held bilateral talks with President Ismail Omar Gulleh and signed an agreement and memorandum of understanding on instituting foreign office consultations and greater economic cooperation with Ethiopia.

Greece, Surinam, and Cuba -June 16 to 19, 2018

The President's State visit to Cuba, marked the first visit by an Indian leader to the country in more than six decades. He spoke on the issue of global cooperation and stressed the importance of South-South cooperation. He held



wide-ranging talks with the Cuban President to further cement the strong bilateral ties.

Cyprus, Bulgaria and Czech Republic - September 2 to 4, 2018

President Kovind was on a 3 - nation visit to Europe between September 2 and 4, 2018.

During his visit to Bulgaria, he held detailed talks with President Rumen Radey and invited Bulgaria to become a key partner of India in Defence and in the IT sector under the Make In India program. He signed four memoranda of understanding on investment, tourism, civil nuclear cooperation and the establishment of a Hindi Chair at Sofia University.

In the Czech Republic, both countries called for reform of the UN Security Council. The President of India invited a Czech defence company to take advantage of the opening of the defence manufacturing sector in India and to setup joint ventures in India.

Vietnam and Australia -November 18 to 21, 2018

President Kovind visited Vietnam from November 18 to 21, 2018, on the first leg of his visit to Vietnam and Australia. This was his first visit to an ASEAN country. He visited Da Nang, Me Son, Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh. During his visit, the President addressed the National Assembly of Vietnam, the second foreign leader to do so after the Chinese President Xi Jingping.

In Australia, India and Australia signed five agreements to boost investments and enhance cooperation. The agreements include pacts on

delivering services to people with disabilities and fostering scientific collaboration and innovation. Expansion of the Australia-India Mining Partnership at the Indian School of Mines, connecting Australian companies to India's mineral-rich North Eastern states was also discussed.

Unassuming, sober and shy of Publicity

On assuming the post of the 14th President of India, Ram Nath Kovind travelled to his village by train. He of course used the helicopter for the last leg. On landing in his village, he bowed down to touch the earth; a very traditional gesture of reaching home. He then prayed at the village temple.

And when Prime Minister Modi visited his village, President Kovind broke with protocol and travelled to his village to play the host. Such is his attachment to his village and community.

When he visited his alma mater, he again broke protocol by stepping down from the dais and touching the feet of his nonagenarian teachers; again a traditional sign of respect and high values.

As he demits office, the nation will remember him as a politically neutral and secularly proper President of India. During his term in office, he openly gave appointments to the opposition party members. All his visits to religious places and religious functions were outside the Rashtrapati Bhavan.

The President of India demits office on 25 July 2022 after a noncontroversial 5 year term.

Speeding up Infrastructure Development

PM Gati Shakti – National Master Plan seeks to improve coordination between Ministries and their Departments improve project management at the National Level.

he Prime Minister had launched the PM Gati Shakti - National Master Plan for Multimodal Connectivity between various ministries, on 13 October 2021. This is essentially a digital platform that brings together various Ministries and departments, including the Railways and Roadways, for integrated planning and coordinated implementation of infrastructure connectivity projects. The multi-modal connectivity is aimed at providing integrated and seamless

connectivity for movement of people, goods and services from one mode of transport to another. It will facilitate the last mile connectivity of infrastructure and also reduce travel time for people.

The objective of PM Gati Shakti is to ensure that all departments have visibility of each other's activities providing critical data for planning and execution of projects in a comprehensive manner. By doing this, different departments will be able to prioritise work and execute projects

optimally and smoothly.

The scheme incorporates the infrastructure schemes of various Ministries and State Governments like Bharatmala, Sagarmala, inland waterways, dry/land ports, UDAN etc. Economic Zones like textile clusters, pharmaceutical clusters, defence corridors, electronic parks, industrial corridors, fishing clusters, agri-zones are covered to improve connectivity and to make Indian business more competitive. PM Gati Shakti will



also leverage technology extensively by including spatial planning tools with ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation) imagery developed by BiSAG-N (Bhaskaracharya National Institute for Space Applications and Geoinformatics).

Traditionally, there was lack of coordination between different Departments. For instance, once a road was constructed, other agencies dug up the constructed road again for activities like laying of underground cables, gas pipelines etc. This caused great inconvenience and resulted in wasteful expenditure. To address this, efforts were made to increase coordination so that all cables, pipelines etc. could be laid simultaneously. Steps have also been taken to address other issues like prolonged approval process, multiplicity of regulatory clearances etc. In the last few years, the Government has ensured unprecedented focus

on infrastructure through a holistic outlook. This helps to address the past issues through institutionalizing holistic planning for stakeholders for major infrastructure projects. Instead of planning & designing separately in silos, the projects will be designed and executed with a common vision. This 100 lakh crore project aims to develop a 'holistic infrastructure' including development, productivity growth, energy transmission, climate action, and investment financing.

Seven engines drive the approach of PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan; roads, railways, airports, ports, mass transport, waterways, and logistics infrastructure.

Institutional Structure

A Network Planning Group (NPG) comprising of technical experts from each of the 16 infrastructure ministries will examine every connectivity project that costs more than Rs. 500 cores. In the next step, the projects cleared by the NPG will be scrutinised and approved by an Empowered Group of Secretaries (EGoS) headed by the Cabinet Secretary. In this way, infrastructure project implementation will be speeded up and facilitated with high level attention and coordination.

- Ministry of Civil Aviation

A project monitoring group under the Department of Promotion of Industry and Internal trade (DPIIT) will monitor the progress of key projects in real-time. They will also report any inter-ministerial issues to a group of ministries, who will then aim to resolve these.

The Six Pillars

PM Gati Shakti is based on the following six pillars:

Comprehensiveness: Include all the existing and planned initiatives of various Ministries and Departments within one centralized portal. Each Department will then have visibility of each other's activities providing critical data for planning and execution of

- projects comprehensively.
- Prioritization: Through crosssectoral interactions, different Departments will be able to prioritize their projects.
- Optimization: After identifying critical gaps, the National Master Plan will enable different ministries in planning for projects. For the transportation of the goods from one place to another, the Plan will help in selecting the most optimum route in terms of time and cost.
- Synchronization: Individual Ministries and Departments often work in silos. There is lack of coordination in planning and implementation of the project resulting in delays. The National Master Plan will help in synchronizing and co-ordinating activities of each department, as well as of different layers of governance.
- Analytical: The plan will provide the entire data at one place with GIS based spatial planning and analytical tools having 200+ layers, enabling better visibility to the executing agency.
- Dynamic: All Ministries and Departments will be able to see, review and monitor the progress of cross-sectoral

projects. Through the GIS platform, the satellite imagery will give on-ground progress periodically and progress of the projects will be updated on a regular basis on the portal. It will help in identifying the vital interventions for enhancing and updating the Master Plan.

Targets

PM Gati Shakti has set targets for all infrastructure ministries and the targets to be achieved by 2024-25 are:

11 industrial corridors and 2 new defence corridors (Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh),

- achieving a 1.7 lakh crore turnover in defence production.
- 2. Around 38 electronics manufacturing clusters
- 3. 109 pharma clusters
- 4. Increase in the total cargo handled at Indian ports to 1759 **MTPA**
- Adding over 200 airports, 5. helipads, and water aerodromes.
- 6. Extending 4G connectivity to all villages
- 7. Adding 17,000 km to the gas pipeline network is being planned

- 2022-23. Twenty thousand crores will be allotted to expand the national highway network by 25,000 kilometres in 2022-23.

What is the need for the Plan?

- To address the wide gap between macro planning and micro implementation due to the lack of coordination and advanced information sharing, arising on account of departments thinking and working in silos.
- As per reports, studies estimate the logistics costs in India at about 13-14% of GDP as against about 7-8% in developed economies. With this high logistical cost, the

- competitiveness of India's exports is greatly reduced.
- It will increase economic activities and create employment on a large scale due to the creation of quality infrastructure for sustainable development.
- The scheme is in synergy with the National Monetisation Pipeline (NMP) which was announced to provide a clear framework for monetization and give potential investors a ready list of assets to generate investor interest.
- A holistic and integrated transport connectivity strategy will greatly support 'Make in India' and integrate different modes of transport.
- Another push for such a scheme was the lack of demand in the post-Covid-19 scenario, which in turn led to a lack of private demand and investment demand.
- Due to land acquisition delays and litigation issues, the rate of implementation of projects is very slow on global standardsissues that the scheme will address.

The Best States for Start-ups

Gujarat and Karnataka adjudged Best Performers among states; Meghalaya is the Best Performers among UTs and North-Eastern States.

he results of the third edition of Ranking of States on Support to Start-up Ecosystems were released by Shri Piyush Goyal, Minister of Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, and Textiles on 4 July 2022.

The Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has been conducting the States' Start-up Ranking Exercise since 2018 to facilitate the ease of doing business and building a start-up ecosystem of across the country. The exercise has grown in its impact over the last three editions, with 31 participating states and union territories in this edition, the highest till date. The State Start-up Ranking Exercise aims to support states and union territories in developing their start-up ecosystem and learn from the best practices in each state and union territory.

The period under consideration for the third edition of the States Start-up

Ranking Exercise was 1st October 2019 to 31st July 2021. The documentary evidence submitted was evaluated over a 6-month duration. The Evaluation Committee assessed each document in detail. The Evaluation Committee comprises of representatives from 19 government departments and 29 non-government start-up ecosystem stakeholders, for fair and transparent evaluation.

Participating States and UTs were evaluated across 7 broad Reform Areas consisting of 26 Action Points. The broad reform areas are Institutional Support, Fostering Innovation and Entrepreneurship, Access to Market, Incubation support, Funding Support, Mentorship Support and Capacity Building of Enablers. The exercise plays a crucial role in easing the business environment for start-ups in the country.

The States Start-up Ranking 2021 highlighted the support being extended by the 31 states and union territories through

start-up policies to the ecosystem. There were only 4 states with start-up policies prior to 2016. The state start-up teams have been extending support across mentorship, incubation and funding. Feedback was gathered from more than 7,000 beneficiaries through surveys made in 13 different languages to grasp the real situation at the level of beneficiaries.

For the purposes of the Ranking, States and Union Territories are classified into 5 Categories, viz. Best Performers, Top Performers, Leaders, Aspiring Leaders and Emerging Start-up



Ecosystems.

- Gujarat and Karnataka emerged as the Best Performers in a category of States which included NCT of Delhi. Meghalaya won the top honour among UTs and Northeastern (NE) States.
- While Kerala, Maharashtra, Orissa and Telangana won the Top Performers award among states, Jammu & Kashmir emerged as the Top Performer among UTs and NE states.
- Assam, Punjab, Tamil Nādu, Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh were adjudged the winners in the Leaders category among states;
- Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Arunachal Pradesh and Goa bagged the Leaders honour among the UTs and NE states.
- Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan were declared as Aspiring Leaders among the States.

- Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli & Daman and Diu, Himachal Pradesh, Manipur, Nagaland, Puducherry and Tripura were the Aspiring Leaders from the UTs and NE states.
- Andhra Pradesh and Bihar from States category and Mizoram and Ladakh from the UTs/NE States were clubbed under the Emerging Start-up Ecosystem.

get more start-ups on the Government E-Marketplace (GeM), as Services have now been brought under GeM.

The Minister felt there was a need to focus on developing a start-up ecosystem in districts with support from all the start-up related schemes of the Central and the State governments. He emphasized the need to on-board and register more start-ups. He added that there was a great opportunity to

profitable start-ups, improving their corporate governance, scaling up their operations, addressing funding gaps and building their brand. Shri Manoj Kohli, Member, National Start-up Advisory Council said this would improve their success rate.

The call for mentors for MAARG portal was also announced during the event. The portal has been developed with the objective of developing a tool



After declaring the awards, Shri Piyush Goyal said that the Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC) had the power to spawn thousands of start-ups. The success of UPI in India has democratised the payment system in India. In the next 5 years, ONDC could democratize e-commerce across India resulting in a few thousand start-ups and a few hundred unicorns in India, according to Shri Piyush Goyal. "Rather than three companies being 100 billion or one trillion size, you will have a thousand companies each of a billion dollar. That is what ONDC has the power to do," the Minister said.

Emphasizing that Indian ecosystem could become the best, Shri Goyal suggested that States should align with neighbouring ones to learn from each other. He also asked the department to democratize the start-up ecosystem in the same way as the Indian Premier League (IPL) democratized the cricket arena.

The minister appreciated the new mentorship program and said that it would help those with ideas to get support and help them fructify their ideas. A number of initiatives of the government including JAM (Jandhan, Aadhar, Mobile), Digital India, Gatishakti, and Ease of Doing Business were driving the start-up ecosystem, according to the Secretary, DPIIT. "If the Start-up system has to grow further, the biggest role has to be played by States. We can play a facilitative role," he added.

The new coaching/mentoring programme Mentorship, Advisory, Assistance, Resilience and Growth (MAARG) would focus on creating

for start-ups in India that can be accessed from every corner of the country to request and connect with a mentor.

Smt. Shruti Singh, Joint Secretary, DPIIT said that the start-up ecosystem has come a long way with States playing a big role. "Today, States have vibrant ecosystem with 27 states having their portals in regional languages," she added.

A felicitation ceremony was accompanied by the release of the National Report which highlights the vision, framework, evolution across the years, methodology and implementation, and the way ahead for the States' Startup Ranking. A State Specific Report for each of the 31 participating States and Union Territories has also been released, containing an extensive analysis of respective ecosystem, which highlights strengths and priority areas for future.



Flying High!!

After a long period of forced restrictions on their business, Airlines are now looking forward to a happy comeback. They are leaving no stones unturned to get there.

omestic and international flights have restarted for a while now. Passenger travel, both for personal and corporate purposes, has been on the rise for some months. Initially there may have been some hesitation on the part of the passengers and the authorities, but gradually this too has been overcome. In international travel there are still some Covid-19 related compliances for travellers to follow and these vary between countries. However, these compliances do not seem to hinder free international passenger movement. What does this mean for airlines providing services on domestic and international routes? We asked five domestic and international airlines about their views.

Expectations for Passenger traffic

There is a high expectation of reaching the pre-Covid passenger loads in the very near future. All Airlines we interviewed have seen a significant uptick in passenger travel.

Dipendra Karna, the Communications Manager at Budhha

Air is quite optimistic about the near future. "During the Covid-19 pandemic, we were obliged to shut our services for six months during the first lockdown and further two months during the second. But as the industry gradually opened up, we did quite well in getting our flights and services back on track. In Q3 of the fiscal year 2020-21, we had around 5 lakhs passengers, and in the fiscal year 2021-22, we had more than 6 lakh. That is a 21.9% increase in the number of passengers in a year. Similarly, in Q4 of 2020-21, we catered to around 76 thousand passengers as it was the time of the second covid-19





lockdown. In 2021-22, more than 5lakh people flew with us. That is an 85.6% increase in the no. of passengers. With this rate, we are optimistic to gain more passengers in the upcoming fiscal year." he said.

Tigist Eshetu, Regional Director India Sub Continent, Ethiopian Airlines expects a steady growth in traffic in the current year. She said "We are expecting an approximate minimum over all Load Factor per flight: EX Mumbai - 85%; Delhi - 75% on our prime night flights & EX Bengaluru -70% in the comings months. Further with the expected introductions of additional destinations connectivity to our mid-day flights EX Mumbai &



Delhi we expect load improvement on these flights as well. Whilst overall Africa traffic volume has not yet reached pre COVID levels, there is a steady improvement the in same, especially leisure traffic to South Africa in particular, and corporate travel to several African destinations as well, hence we expect a steady growth in both economy and business class travel."

Indigo Airlines have seen a consistent increase in the number of travelers over the last 4-5 months, with Indians taking domestic flights as well as international flights. With a market share of 57.9%, IndiGo carried 69.90 lakhs passengers in the month of May according to a DGCA report. They

saw a 100% recovery in corporate and business travel in April and May and expect the demand for it to soon exceed pre-pandemic levels. Currently, IndiGo is operating over 1600 daily flights and connecting 73 domestic destinations and 24 international destinations.

According to **Amit Mehta- Country** Manager, South Asia, Malaysia

Throughout the pandemic, our "yield active, load factor passive" strategy proved effective in not only keeping us afloat but leading us to return to a positive cash-flow since October last year. We are on track to return to our pre-pandemic financial performance by the Q4 2023 or, conservatively, Q1 2024.

revenue streams. However, the market will remain volatile. We are now facing significant headwinds with high fuel prices and overcapacity. This will put tremendous pressure on our financials as we must carefully balance increasing capacity and profitability."

"During Q3 & Q4 going by current trend we expect that our load factors would be in top high levels & travel demand from all market segments will swell. The uncertain geo political situation will continue to apply pressure on Fuel prices, Forex & aviation's bottom line." said Atul Bhatara, Manager India & South Asian Subcontinent at Air Mauritius

Encouraging Corporate and Personal travel

Ethiopian Airlines is actively encouraging travel. Tigist Eshetu said "We already have in place schemes, like supplementary cut-n-pay commission, Tour based fares to selected top selling



Airlines, they would like to restore the pre-COVID-19 capacity for domestic and international travel by the end of 2022. He said "Our capacity is currently at 50% of the pre-COVID-19 level projected for June, with a significant increase in ticket sales following the reopening of the Malaysian border.

We are progressively ramping up our capacity and introducing strategic route expansion in view of the reopening of borders to international destinations, as we anticipate travel demand for international travel to pick up. Recently we launched our inaugural direct flight from KUL to DOH and will be servicing KUL to HND beginning August 2022. We have also established an agreement with the Uzbek government to operate charter flights between the two countries; expanding our presence beyond our current network through smart partnerships.

While we are bullish for 2022, we remain cautious of the environments and will deploy fleet and network expansion opportunistically during peak periods to service high demand/



We must continue to be pro-active in managing our capacity and operations to mitigate unprofitable routes due to rising fuel costs and market conditions. We are cautious of potential downsides and market fluidity and are taking steps to cushion the impact they may have on our businesses.

As part of the Malaysia Aviation Group (MAG), we have to look at the aviation ecosystem in its entirety, and not just as a pure-play airlines business as it has traditionally been. This is both to cater to the demands of aviation services and diversify our



agents and have also renewed most of our pre COVID corporate agreements with our clients and are have a number of new corporates tie-ups in the pipe line as well."

Air Mauritius plans to undertake mass marketing, FM radio advertising, digital Marketing investment, and Joint marketing with MTPA (Mauritius Tourism Promotion Authority) in addition to B2B road shows, event associations, and Print advertising.

Whereas, with an aim to support and make the booking process flexible for its customers, Indigo Airlines have

According to Indigo Airline, their growing network across metros, nonmetros, and many leisure destinations such as Agra, Bareilly, Darbhanga, Pantnagar, Dehradun, Jabalpur, Kurnool, Gwalior, Kanpur, Kadapa, etc. provide added options for the travelers to get into various destinations with convenient connectivity.

Along with this, they also provide ancillary services to customers like fast forward priority check-in & Baggage-Quick board, delayed & lost baggage protection, and door-to-door baggage







This combines with the higher ride height and rugged cladding around the car to disguise



the length and makes it look like it is pushing forward in a sporty way," added Leclercq.

At a length of 4600 mm, the New ë-C4 X and C4 X slot neatly into the Citroën line-up between the C4 hatchback at 4360 mm long, and the C5 X at 4800 mm. Its wheelbase at 2670 mm is same as C4 hatch as both are based on the company's CMP Platform.

With a drag coefficient of just Cd 0.29, aerodynamic efficiency has been optimised thanks to the fast, crisp roofline, which directly benefits range and fuel efficiency - the all-electric New ë-C4 X achieving a range of up to 360 km (224 miles) WLTP.

When viewed in profile, the car's dynamic roofline flows effortlessly and seamlessly from the top of the windscreen into the top panel of the boot lid to create a fastback silhouette that appears planted rather than ungainly, which is often the case with taller cross-segment vehicles. The rear overhang intelligently disguises the length required to package the capacious 510-litre boot.

The rear panel of the boot lid which folds down towards the rear bumper is clean and uncluttered with a softly integrated spoiler at the top, subtle folds below and central Citroën lettering. The panel itself leans slightly towards the front of the car further enhancing the prestigious feel of the rear-end design and heightening the car's attitude of forward momentum.

Distinctive new LED tail lamps are

placed either side of the boot opening and carry through the sculpted lines of the boot lid, pushing around the corners and along the sides of the car, complementing the distinctive front lamps and terminating in an arrow shape before the rear door, which further amplifies the silhouette's dynamism.

Below the boot opening, the unique rear bumper neatly houses a central number plate recess, and the lower bumper skirt is finished in matt black for protection and durability. Adding relief and elegance are gloss black inserts, while distinctive outer scoops echo the rugged feel of the C5 Aircross.

Larger 690mm diameter wheels combined with a short front overhang give the car a raised ride height which results in a more elevated driving position, reassuring drivers with a sense of surefootedness. Not Guilty!!

A Swiss Court finds former FIFA President and Vice President are found not guilty of corruption charges levelled against them more than 7 years ago



ased on an approval from the former President of FIFA, Sepp Blatter, FIFA made a payment of CHF 2 million to the then Vice President, Michel Platini. The payment was made in 2011 as consultancy charges for services rendered by Michel Platini to FIFA a few years before.

In his testimony during the trial, Blatter said he asked Platini to be his adviser when he was first appointed President of football's world governing body in 1998. He said the former Captain of the French Football team. Michel Platini wanted CHF 1m (£816,030) per year but Blatter told him FIFA could not afford that fee. They instead settled on CHF 300,000 (£244,809) per year, with the outstanding total to be paid at a later date. The two sports men shook hands on their "gentleman's agreement".

Platini stopped working for FIFA in 2002 but did not pursue the payment until 2010, telling the court he had not needed the money at the time, when - according to Blatter - FIFA was in any case "broke". However, Platini later heard that two former employees had received substantial payments. He approached FIFA and asked to send an invoice. He did so in January 2011, with the money paid 10 days later after approval by Blatter.

The Swiss Office of the Attorney

General accused Blatter and Platini of "fraud, in the alternative of misappropriation, in the further alternative of criminal mismanagement as well as of forgery of a document". The invoice sent by Platini was considered to be a forged document for a fictitious debt.

Motives for the payment were unclear, although the two sportsmen met in 2010 and discussed the upcoming elections for the FIFA presidency in 2011. When Blatter approved the payment, he was campaigning for re-election against Mohamed bin Hammam of Qatar. Platini, then president of UEFA, was seen as having sway with European members who could influence the vote. The payment emerged following a huge investigation launched by the US Department of Justice into bribery, fraud and money-laundering at FIFA in 2015, which triggered Blatter's resignation.

Both officials were banned from football for eight years in 2015 over the payment, although their bans were later reduced. Platini, who was also charged as an accomplice, said he felt the ban was a deliberate attempt to stop him from becoming FIFA president in 2015

The case started in 2015, and thorough investigations were carried out which included raids led by the Federal Bureau of Investigations at FIFA's Zurich hotel. The 11-day trial of the two football personalities over the 2011 payment took place at the Federal Criminal Court in Bellinzona and was recently concluded.

The Court released a statement after the trial which said that the result of the evidence supports the version of the accused. The facts of the indictment cannot therefore be considered to have been created with a probability bordering on certainty.

Although the two football personalities have been acquitted of wrong-doing their illustrious careers have been marred over this controversy and the actions taken against them.



Michel François Platini (born 21 June 1955) is a former French football player and manager. Regarded as one of the greatest footballers of all time, Platini won the Ballon d'Or for three consecutive years in 1983, 1984 and 1985. In recognition of his achievements, he was named a Chevalier of the Légion d'honneur in 1985 and became an Officier in 1998.

Nicknamed Le Roi (The King) for his ability and leadership, he was a prolific goal scorer; he won the Serie A capocannoniere award three consecutive times between 1983 and 1985, and was the top scorer of Juventus's victorious 1984-85 European Cup campaign. Platini was a key player of the France national team that won the 1984 European Championship, a tournament in which he was the top scorer and best player, and reached the semi-finals of the 1982 and 1986 World Cups.

Following his retirement as a player, Platini was the France national team

coach for four years, and was the co-organizer of the 1998 World Cup in France. In 2007, he became the first former player to be elected as the president of the Union of European Football Associations (UEFA). He also held the positions of chairman of FIFA's Technical and Development Committee and vice-president of the French Football Federation.

Joseph "Sepp" Blatter (born 10 March 1936) is a former Swiss football administrator who served as the eighth President of FIFA from 1998 to 2015. From a background in business, public relations, and sports administration, Blatter became general secretary of FIFA in 1981 and was then elected president at the 51st FIFA Congress on 8 June 1998. Blatter was re-elected in 2002, 2007, 2011, and 2015. Like his predecessor, Blatter sought to increase the influence of African and Asian countries in world football through the expansion of participating teams in various FIFA tournaments.





